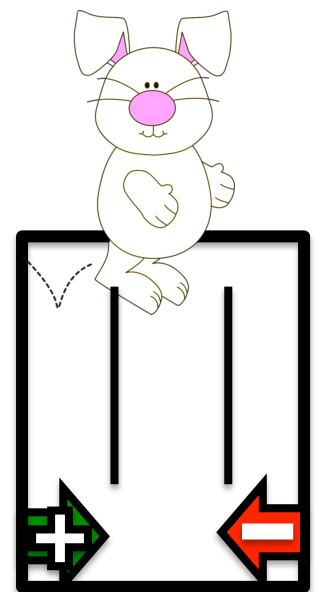
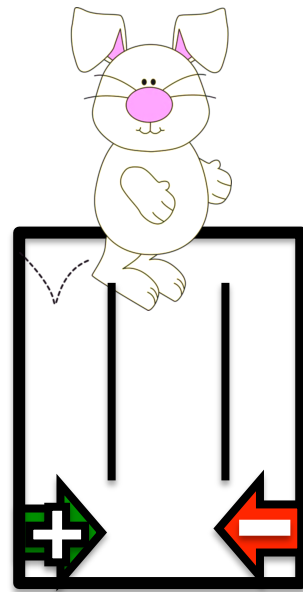
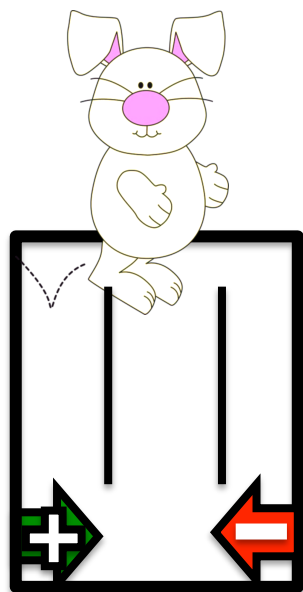
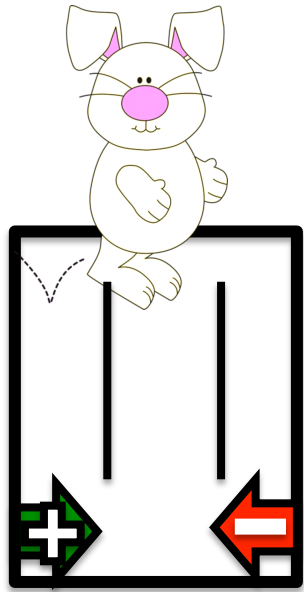
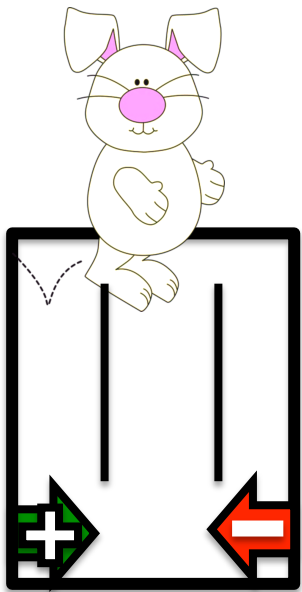
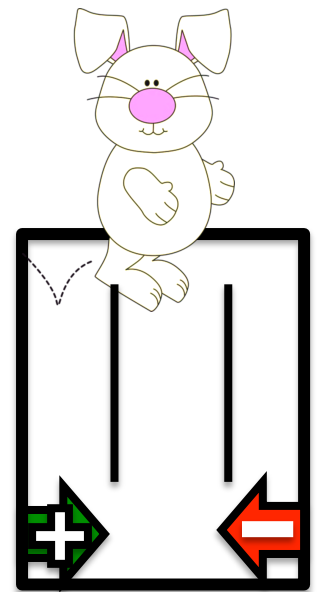
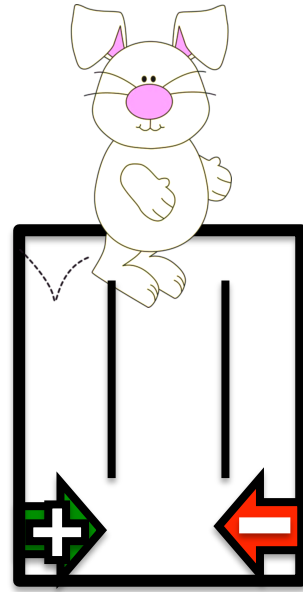
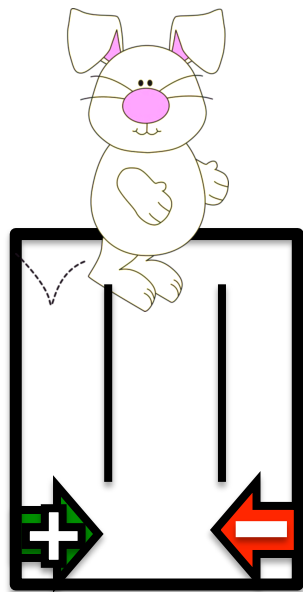
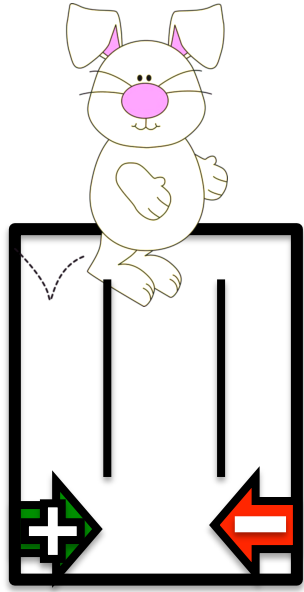
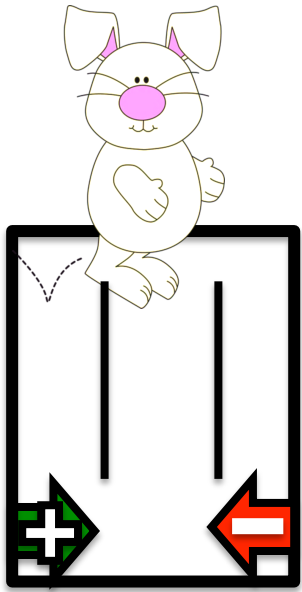


Bunny Hop Number Line Slides are a cute and easy way to count up and back from 1-20 on the number line. I intentionally did not put zero at the end so that if you leave a half inch or so of white at the end of the page when fitting to paper size, the children will see “nothing” there in this spot when you start at 2 and take away or subtract 2 it equals nothing or zero. The uses for this are endless!

Assembly:

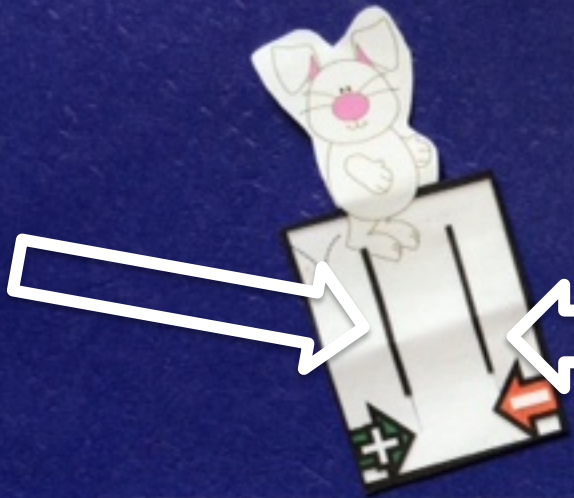
1. Run off the materials onto cardstock or heavier grade paper.
2. Laminate number lines and cut to size. You can cut from 1-10 if that is where your students are.
3. Copy the bunnies onto heavier grade paper and laminate.
4. Cut each bunny and slide out. I just cut around the ears and body so it is close put not exact.
5. Carefully fold the bunnies in half so the black lines are on the outside.
6. Cut from the fold up to the end of the center black lines. Be careful not to cut all the way up or it will not be attached.
7. Lace the number line through the bunny frame so it slides back and forth! YOU DID IT!

I hope this freebie brings a little sunshine your way and that it supports your kiddos in counting, adding and subtracting numbers up to 20. ENJOY!





After laminating, fold at center with black showing out and cut on fold up toward the bunny on the the black center lines as indicated.



Leave a little white showing at each end for easier movement and the blank to the left of the 1 to show "Nothing" is left. If you don't have space at the ends you can add white cut paper before laminating!
